



# Lesson: Linear Symmetry

When two sides of a letter look the same, or mirror each other, we say that they have linear symmetry. We call it linear symmetry because we can actually draw a line down the middle of the letter that divides it into two mirror images. This line is called the line of symmetry.

	
The letter A has one line of symmetry.	The letter H has two lines of symmetry.



The letters F & Z have no lines of symmetry.
